e believe that community engagement propels us forward. Through our community engagement we have made friends with non-profits, small businesses, artists, and neighbors who share this value. Together we are building strong and viable communities.

I'm proud of the Verity team's commitment to service and community engagement. In 2016 we set a goal of 1,500 staff volunteer hours. I'm happy to share that Verity staff exceeded that goal with more than 2,723 hours of volunteering.

While we're fairly new to community engagement, we're learning how much we can accomplish when we team up with you, our members and neighbors.

On October 10th, we held our second annual Verity Community Service Day. Eighty-nine Verity staff members spent the day in four different communities.

We harvested apples for City Fruit in Wallingford and tended green spaces at the Phinney Center. We gave the Greenwood Senior Center a deep cleaning. We also helped clients of Mary's Place keep an eye on their little ones as they prepared for job interviews.

Throughout the year, Verity staff came together as volunteers for organizations such as FareStart, Teen Feed and the Ronald McDonald House.

I'm excited to see our community engagement evolve at the branch level. Greenwood's Verity branch planned a fund raiser in conjunction with neighboring businesses that netted over \$1,800 for a local hot meals program. Our Ballard team hosted a very successful food drive for the Ballard Food Bank. We value opportunities like these to support what our communities care about.

While we're fairly new to community engagement, we're learning how much we can accomplish when we team up with you, our members and neighbors. In 2017 we look forward to launching our first grants program, building more partnerships with businesses and non-profits, and continuing to make the communities we live in more vibrant and healthy.

We have a long history of empowering employees to provide service to community. In 2016, we challenged ourselves to go further than we have in the past. Staff rose to the challenge, meaningfully impacting each of our branch communities and then some:

- 2.723 staff volunteer hours
- 105 volunteer locations
- \$28,308 in monetary donations
- 141 causes impacted

# Rebuilding a community

In March, Greenwood suffered a terrible tragedy. A natural gas explosion obliterated three businesses, damaged 53 others, and displaced several residents.

Verity was proud to be at the forefront of efforts to raise and distribute relief funds. Six months later, at ground zero, a celebration of healing was held to honor the first responders and community members who came together to help Greenwood heal.

Throughout 2016, Verity continued to support the greater Greenwood community. In the summer, Verity held a free concert for Greenwood and bought attendees food from Mr. Gyros, a business impacted by March's natural gas explosion. In the fall, Verity partnered with the Flying Bike Cooperative to hold an auction to raise funds for the Phinney Neighborhood Association's Hot Meal program.

# **Tutoring young neighbors**

Northgate's branch and administrative office staff volunteered their time to tutor Northgate Elementary School students in math and reading. Many of the students participate in the reduced/free lunch program.

# **Securing member privacy**

In July, Beacon Hill's branch staff welcomed the return of our annual community shred-a-thon to their branch. This year's event supported a local area food bank by inviting members and the community at large to shred personal documentation in exchange for a monetary or non-perishable food item donation. Our members win... the community wins... the food bank wins... nice!



Our Financial Coach, Charnell Morud, has over 20 years of experience helping consumers. Since the coaching program launched in 2008, Charnell has helped over 700 members and managed over \$13 million in mortgage debt. Best of all, this service is complimentary to Verity members!

### Ask our coach:

New in 2016! Quarterly at each branch, Charnell hosts Ask Our Coach, an everyday finance drop in session. Especially handy if you don't need a private appointment but have a few questions.

#### **Round-table Discussions:**

Also new in 2016, round-table discussions are offered quarterly at our Alderwood and Beacon Hill branches. They are lunchtime gatherings to discuss credit reports, debt management and holiday spending.

Verity means truth – and this guides our actions. We will always be genuine and authentic, engaging in truthful interactions for the betterment of our communities, the people there, and their collective well-being.

he arts play a huge role in connecting Seattle communities. This guided us to work with local artists and musicians to create our brand images and sounds.

Since 2015, we've exclusively highlighted local artists in "truth art" we have commissioned for this purpose. After all, verity means "the state or quality of being true or real."



We want to showcase the diversity of talent and styles that make Seattle so unique.



To date, six musical acts and six visual artists have created truth art for Verity. Plus, we have showcased dozens of other artists in our pop-up concerts and community windows in Ballard's and Greenwood's Verity branches.





As an advocate for local arts, we encourage each band and artist to use their own style in their truth art. We want to showcase the diversity of talent and styles that make Seattle so unique. All we ask is for our artists to represent what truth means to them, and incorporate the word verity, our V image and/or colors (depending on the medium).

Even though they are all given the same prompts, the pieces created are so varied. For example, The Banner Days' song "Time" says, "So we'll pack our Verity for the sake of clarity, and the truth will sing in time." In contrast, Naomi Wachira says, "Verity is what I hope to give you; a promise that I will keep." Their styles, genre, and tone make the pieces even more different from each other – and from the four bands featured in 2015.



# **Living healthy**

Verity's employee Wellness Committee strives to create a culture of wellness in all aspects of mind, body, soul and environment. Our signature event is our annual employee Health and Wellness fair – in 2016, it was opened to our members and the public for the first time.


